Message from the Principal

Today is a Ministry-allocated teacher-only day in many Dunedin schools. I hope that you will be able to make the most of the extra-long weekend, with Monday also being a public holiday for King's Birthday weekend. Today, the staff are working together on literacy practice, restorative practice, and a session on cultural responsiveness. This will include structures and strategies specific to supporting our English language learners. It is always a productive day when we can do this work together for a more sustained period and without having taught all day first.

This week, we have had St John in the school working with our senior students around wellbeing. We have also had the DCC here again, covering dog safety with the junior students. These additional programmes are really valuable and add to our students' knowledge and experiences.

Sickness levels have been higher over the last couple of weeks. We are still focusing on attendance levels but understand the fine balance required to keep all our children and staff healthy.

Reports are currently being written and will be coming home in a couple of weeks. These will be followed by parent interviews on the 18th 19th and 20th June, so keep an eye out for booking details. As in previous years we will be starting interviews at 1pm on Tuesday 18th June and invite parents to collect children early on this day. Any children left at school will be supervised by out Teacher Aide Staff.

As we move further into winter, it is a good time to check that you have the Skool Loop app on your phone and notifications on so that you can receive instant notifications of any late starts or weather-related closures.

Next week, we have our Mathematics facilitator here from Christchurch for a day. Elmgrove is part of a pilot programme looking at quality assessment and teaching practice in Mathematics. A number of our teachers will be attending this session, and we will have visitors from other schools here also observing and working in our classrooms. I am excited about this work and the benefits for all our students.




