Message from the Principal

Welcome back to the new term. It is great to see all of our tamariki back at school and sharing their holiday experiences with their friends, teachers and classmates. We have jumped straight back into our programmes. Our middle school hubs have already started swimming lessons this week and the smell of chlorine in their classrooms is quite obvious. This is an important part of the school programme and a valuable skill for all children.

We have identified children for additional support programmes this term and if your child has been selected for this you should have received a letter about this work. We are very fortunate to have both Mr Liffiton and Mrs Heller available to take some of these programmes. I am also working with a math group this term and I am looking forward to the time with these students.

Our parent fundraising team are working hard to raise funds for the upgrade to the senior courts. We are looking at adding playing turf and a new hoop and court layout to this area. As you can imagine this project is not cheap and we really appreciate the work this team does to raise some of these funds. They currently have two fundraisers underway. The first is the **Bingo Night on 17 May** which is only two weeks away. The team urgently need some prizes for the raffles on the night. If you or your work can donate some items for this it would really help. The team will be making up prize packs and any donation is well received. While having some slightly bigger prizes will be good lots of smaller items are also just as good. *You may be able to donate some chocolate, a nice sauce, a packet of biscuits or even a scented candle. If you have something you can donate to support this fundraiser please drop it to the office or send it to school with your child.*

The other fundraiser is toilet paper and handy towels. These have arrived and order forms to purchase these came out today. Take them off your shopping list and purchase them from school when the form comes out. We are still looking for some people to join our valuable fundraising teams. They are a small group working hard, and more members would enable them to spread the load. Even you if have the capacity to undertake a shared responsibility for one fundraiser this year we want to hear from you.

The Board of Trustees has updated all of the school policy documents over the last year and these have now been put online via the School docs platform. I have included a document in this week's newsletter which tells you a little more about how to access these and also how to provide feedback to the school on our policies. As part of these policies you will find reference to the newly mandated no cell phones in school and reading writing, math requirements put out by the government. Both of these were already in place here at Elmgrove but our policies now reflect the ministry wording. I do remind families that if cell phones are required to be bought to school they need to be handed in and collected at the end of the day.

Our builders are nearly finished our junior school building project. The newly renovated toilet blocks are now being used by the students and these are a significant improvement on what they had previously. The Rata hub have a great new break out space for small group work. The roof replacement is scheduled to be finished this week and we look forward to the removal of the scaffolding and getting our full playground back in action.


Quick Guide to SchoolDocs for the School Community


